<sup>a</sup> The instructor must be a faculty member in the department of chemistry (professor or instructor rank). Research credit for research projects in other departments or off campus can be obtained in two ways: 1) by taking the appropriate 401 course in the other department or, 2) by taking CH 401 with liaison between external faculty or researchers and your chemistry advisor as specified in the external undergraduate research policy webpage.

Students are expected to spend 3-4 hrs/week per CH 401 credit for 10 weeks (one term). For example, 3 credits of CH 401 is 9-12 hrs/week for 10 weeks or 90-120 hrs per term. This includes all work expected by the research mentor and may include, but is not limited to, activities such as: attending Group meetings, searching and writing about the primary literature for the research, performing laboratory or other first hand activities, keeping a laboratory notebook, working with other researchers in the research group (e.g., graduate students, post docs, technicians, and professors). The research professor may have other requirements and these should be documented in the courses description section of this form.

Students taking a CH410 course should review our Internship Related Policies (<https://chemistry.oregonstate.edu/content/internships-1>) for additional requirements, restrictions and information about external and internal internships. Additional paperwork may also be required to register for these specialized blanket courses.
